

Child Power Your Voice - Message to Parents.

You may have noticed on the Child Power Your Voice website that we had included instructions on the homepage to advise children and young people using the site how to delete their online visit history should they wish to.

The ASA believes it necessary to give children and young people the opportunity to have a facility whereby they can report concerns or worries in a safe and confidential environment and have therefore followed the practice on the NSPCC Child Line website.

However, after further consideration and discussions with the NSPCC Child Protection in Sport Unit (CPSU) we recognise that the Child Power Your Voice website is one for children and young people who will not necessarily have a concern and we have therefore removed these instructions from the homepage of the site. The information will remain as a link on the “your chance to talk” section of the Child Power Your Voice website.
