


Bistrot Pierre



What to See

During your stay in Plymouth, make sure you fit in some of the highlights. Soak up the incredible views on offer and enjoy a flavour of the rich and varied history of Britain's Ocean City.

Plymouth Hoe

Spend some time on Plymouth Hoe, which is home to one of the finest views in the world. Take a walk along the Hoe Promenade, with views of the Sound on one side, and the Naval War Memorial on the other. You will also find Smeaton's Tower here, however it is currently under wraps for a restoration. Don't forget to find the 'Beatle Bums' set into the grass on the Hoe and recreate your own version of the fab four's postcard worthy photo.

The Mayflower Museum

The Mayflower Museum explores the story of the Mayflower and the Pilgrims with information and hands-on displays, including dress-up and role play, an incredible model of the Mayflower built by Devonport Dockyard apprentices in 1969 and a list of all the Pilgrims and their hometowns.

Just outside the Mayflower Museum, you will find the newly-refurbished iconic Mayflower Steps which is near to the site from which the Pilgrims are believed to have finally left England aboard the Mayflower, before crossing the Atlantic Ocean to settle in North America on 6 September 1620.

Royal William Yard

Royal William Yard is one of Plymouth's premier lifestyle destinations and is also the largest collection of Grade 1 listed military buildings in Europe.

Accessible by land and sea, the Yard has its own harbour with mooring facilities and Royal William Yard's own ferry service, which makes regular daily trips from the Yard to the Barbican Landing Stage and back. Visitors to the Yard can explore a multitude of independent retailers and galleries including Ocean Studios, restaurants such as Bistrot Pierre, Wildwood, Las Iguanas and Prezzo, a variety of lounge and wine bars including independent French wine lounge Le Vignoble, or simply relax with stunning sea views and open spaces.

How to Travel

Plymouth is a city that's easy to navigate once you're here, whether you're travelling by car, on foot or using our award-winning public transport network, or take to the water and enjoy the coastline.

By Bus

Citybus is the main local bus service provider for Plymouth. You can find out which bus you need to catch, where to catch it from and what time it leaves using the [Citybus Journey Planner](#).

Royal Parade in the city centre serves all areas of the city and beyond and Plymouth Life Centre is served by Citybus routes 12/16/43/50/50A.

The Life Centre can also be accessed via the 101 Park and Ride service which runs every 15 minutes Monday to Friday.

By Boat

Take the opportunity to go by boat and enjoy the stunning coastline scenery whilst exploring local and nearby attractions.

Water Taxis connect The Barbican to Mount Batten, The Royal William Yard Ferry travels back and forth from The Yard to The Barbican, and The Cremyll Ferry at Admirals Hard serves Mount Edgcumbe – the historic house and gardens which overlooks the Plymouth Sound waterfront and Royal William Yard as well as views of Cornwall.

By Taxi

Licensed black cabs operate from Plymouth city centre on Old Town Street left of Royal Parade and will take approximately 8-10 minutes.
