EVENT CONDITIONS FOR BRITISH DIVING CHAMPIONSHIPS 2023

(1.0) GENERAL

- 1.1 British Teams with British eligible divers; have unlimited number of entries, but they must have achieved the qualification standard in the preceding 12 months (See Table 1.2).
- 1.2 Members of International Federations who are members of British clubs may enter under their British Club. but will follow rules 3.1-3.3
- 1.3 Individual events will follow World Aquatic conditions (See Table 1.1) for 1m and 3m springboard and 10m platform. All platform dives to be performed from the 10m platform.
- 1.4 No dive may be repeated in a list of dives.
- 1.5 Minimum age for competitors is 10 years on 31 December in the year of competition
- 1.6 Synchronised events will be straight finals
- 1.7 Late Entries for all events are allowed up to the start of the technical meeting. All late entries will incur a late entry fee. Except late entries to Synchro. The late entry fee for Synchro will be at the discretion of the Head Coach Olympic Diving.
- 1.8 Divers may compete exclusively in synchronised events.

(2.0) FINALS

- 2.1 Divers will perform their dives, competing in the reverse order of their preliminary rankings.
- 2.2 The 6 highest ranked British divers, regardless of ranking overall in the preliminary will proceed to the final.
- 2.3 The finals can consist of a maximum of 12 divers, ranked from the preliminary event, including any guests (IF) divers, see condition 3.2 and 3.3.
- 2.4 Following rules 3.2 and 3.3 the remaining 6 places in the final will be comprised of the remaining divers in ranked order. This may include divers originally ranked outside the top 12.

(3.0) GUESTS (International Federation / Club Entries).

- 3.1 Evidence shall be provided, at the time of entry, to confirm that each foreign diver has achieved the recommended standard for the event they are entering.
- 3.2 A maximum of 6 international divers may proceed to the final unless in the preliminary event, there are fewer than 6 British divers. In this case, additional international divers may proceed to the final.
- 3.3. Individual International Federation Team (Guest) may only qualify a maximum of 2 divers into the final. Multiple club entries from one country will be treated as one International Federation for final qualification purposes.

Welcome to Ponds Forge International Sports Centre

Ponds Forge International Sports Centre is a leisure complex that opened in 1991 containing an Olympic-sized competition pool that allows the seating of 2600 spectators. The competition has hosted the 1993 Men's European Water Polo Championships as part of the 1993 European Aquatics Championships. Other hosted events include the Underwater Hockey World Championships in 2006, as well as the Junior World Championships in 2019. It is also a regular venue for our annual domestic swimming, para-swimming and diving events. Multiple world records have been broken in the pool along the years for both long and short course. The venue is also home to Europe's deepest diving pool at 5.85 metres which hosted the FINA World Diving Championships back in 2011. Ponds Forge also provides a gym that received a £3 million refurbishment in 2009 which houses 130 pieces of equipment as well as a steam room and sauna.






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LOIS LOOKING FORWARD

TO WHAT LIES AHEAD

For all of the divers in attendance, the 2023 British Diving Championships are a chance to make impressions, build on aspirations and showcase their talents and the hours of hard work and dedication shown in training. For City of Leeds' Lois Toulson, this week's competition is also a stepping stone on the way to improving on a strong 2022 season with a big 15 months ahead.

The 23-year-old claimed two medals at both the Commonwealth Games and European Championships last year – her two European golds with synchro partners Andrea Spendolini-Sirieix and Kyle Kothari rounding off what

was an incredibly successful summer for British Diving.

The recent successes have continued. Ahead of the upcoming action in Sheffield. Lois was once again representing Great Britain at the opening two legs of the World Aguatics Diving World Cup in Xi'an and Montreal, taking home a pair of silvers alongside Andrea in the Women's 10m Synchro, Speaking on these competitions and how they help her preparations for other events - Toulson reflected positively on her recent form.

"The World Cup competitions have gone quite well, especially in synchro with me and Andrea having been a new partnership and coming second at our first proper international competitions with two personal bests," she said.

"It's really good and shows the hard work that we've put into the partnership, which is good leading into the rest of the season.

"My individual has been a bit of a mixed bag - a bit of some good and some not so good, but at the start of the season it's good to just get back out there and know what we need to work on. Now, it's time to fix those things at home and really prepare for the summer."

On the synchro front, Lois and Andrea have quickly become a mainstay of international podiums during the first months of their partnership.

"Synchro is going really well. At the end of last year and the start of this year, in the winter training months, we've put a lot of hard work in," added Lois.

"I've been down to London quite a few times now to train with Andrea and really try and get our dives in sync. Our dives individually are good anyway, they're three of our favourite dives that we can bank on most of the time, but we've been really focusing on the required dives and trying to get them to where they need to be.

"It's been really good working with Andrea. She's very fun and she's like a breath of fresh air to be around, especially when I'm the only platform diver in Leeds. It can be a bit lonely sometimes, so it's nice to go down there and train with the rest of them."

Two-time Olympian Toulson burst on to the international scene by securing her Olympic debut aged 16 at Rio 2016, before a memorable silver medal-winning performance in the Mixed 10m Synchro event at the 2017 World Aquatics Championships with partner Matty Lee – a huge moment for the then 17-year-old on a team that included a number of high-profile athletes, as well as divers of a similar age to Toulson.

When asked for her thoughts on now being one of the more senior members of the team in 2023, she was eager to comment on how the positive team dynamic affects a group at the elite level.

"It definitely feels strange being one of the more senior athletes on the team now. It feels like it hasn't been two minutes since I was the new kid on the block, but now it's really nice having quite a diverse team," she reflected.

"From Jack (Laugher) being a multiple
Olympic medallist to the new ones coming
through, it's really nice and our team
dynamic is really good. Also, for the World
Cup competitions that we've done this
season, we've had two separate team
managers and they've both mentioned how
tight-knit we all are and how we are like a
family, so it is really nice travelling together
and getting to experience the highs."

Rounding off the conversation, Toulson – who is coached by Adam Smallwood at the British

Diving Performance Centre, Leeds – gave a bit of insight into how the rest of the year looks for her, as she looks to mount a return to the podium on the world stage come July – and securing those all-important Olympic quota places too.

"It's going to be a busy year with World Champs and then leading into next year when everything is geared up towards Paris. The targets are just to do as well as we can," said Lois.

"I've just got the individual at nationals, so I'll hopefully try and finish in the top two there, then I'm really looking forward to the synchro event at World Champs as we get that first chance to qualify for Paris next year, which is exciting.

"For me, that's the biggest goal for the rest of the season - to try to get that spot with Andrea for the Olympics, but I also have all of my individual goals on the side, which are a bit more personal, such as on individual dives rather than overall targets. I prefer to take individual on a dive by dive basis, rather than looking at it as the whole and getting myself a bit overwhelmed sometimes. So I've got that for the rest of the season and then I'm working hard on synchro with a lot more travelling down to London over the winter months to prepare for next year and everything that has in store."






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
