DIVING NOMINATION POLICY

1 POLICY PURPOSE

- 1.1 This policy outlines the process for nominating the Diving team to the British Olympic Association (BOA) to represent TeamGB at the 2024 Olympic Games in Paris, FRANCE.

2 PERFORMANCE OBJECTIVE

- 2.1 The performance objective for the Diving Team is to maximise medal return at the Paris 2024 Olympic Games.

3 NOMINATION OVERVIEW

- 3.1 All nominations will be made by a Nomination Panel comprising 3 members. The Nomination Panel (the “Panel”) members are: the British Swimming Associate Performance Director, Head Coach Olympic Diving, and the Performance Pathway Lead Olympic Diving, with a record of the nomination meeting taken by a note taker.
- 3.2 An Independent Observer will also attend the nomination meeting to ensure due process, but with no voting rights.
- 3.3 Nominations will be made following the conclusion of the 2024 British Diving Championships, Sandwell Aquatics Centre, 23rd – 26th May 2024, (known as “the British Championships”), subject to clauses 5.1 and 6.1 below.
- 3.4 In the event that the 2024 British Championships are cancelled, a revised Nomination Policy will be published.
- 3.5 Subject to clause 6, in addition to the British Championships performances from the following competitions will also be considered by the Nomination Panel:
- 2024 World Championships, 2nd – 10th February 2024, Doha, Qatar
 - 2024 World Aquatics Diving World Cup events, dates and venues as listed below:
 - STOP1: 29th February – 3rd March 2024, Montreal, Canada
 - STOP 2: 21st – 24th March 2024, Berlin, Germany
 - STOP 3 (Super Final): 19th – 21st April 2024, Xi’an, China
- 3.6 Nominations will be made to the British Olympic Association (BOA). It is the role of the BOA to ratify these nominations and confirm these as formal TeamGB selections.

4 ELIGIBILITY

- 4.1 Only athletes who are a British citizen, have a valid British passport (valid for six months after the Games) and are eligible to represent Great Britain as per the Olympic Charter Rules will be considered. The BOA in consultation with World Aquatics and the International Olympic Committee



("IOC") will decide on any question of eligibility (having regard to all eligibility criteria including as set by the BOA, British Swimming, World Aquatics and the IOC) and the IOC's decision shall be final.

- 4.2 Athletes must meet all requirements set out in clause G1 in the General Conditions of this policy.

5 TEAM SIZE

- 5.1 The International Olympic Committee (IOC) makes provision that each National Federation may enter a maximum of two (2) competitors per event for each individual event and one (1) team of two (2) competitors for each synchronised event, subject to quota places having been qualified.
- 5.2 A list of available quota places will be published on the British Swimming official website (www.britishswimming.org) as soon as possible after the conclusion of the 2024 World Championships, following confirmation by World Aquatics in conjunction with the IOC, but will be capped at a maximum of 16 places.
- 5.3 The split of places by gender will be in accordance with available quota places available and published by British Swimming as per clause 5.2

6 NOMINATION PROCESS

- 6.1 The winner of the British Championships in the Olympic individual events will be nominated to the BOA to represent TeamGB at the 2024 Olympic Games subject to achieving the Qualifying Standards set out in Table 1 in both the Preliminary and Final rounds.
- 6.2 Any additional unallocated places remaining in the Olympic individual events following the application of clause 6.1 will be nominated to the BOA to represent TeamGB at the 2024 Olympic Games at the complete discretion of the Panel. The Panel will apply its discretion in accordance with achieving the performance objectives set out in 2.1 and the application of discretion by the Panel will be recorded in the nomination meeting.
- 6.3 For the Olympic Synchronised teams, divers will be nominated to the BOA to represent TeamGB at the 2024 Olympic Games at the complete discretion of the Panel. The Panel will apply its discretion in accordance with achieving the performance objectives set out in 2.1 and the application of discretion by the Panel will be recorded in the nomination meeting.
- 6.4 In exceptional circumstances, the Panel reserves the right to select athletes for the Olympic Synchronised teams prior to the British Championships, at any time following the conclusion of the 2024 World Championships (date and venue as noted above) to support the performance objective set out in clause 2.1

7 EVENT ENTRIES

- 7.1 This policy nominates divers for the 2024 Olympic Games. The Head Coach Olympic Diving in consultation with the Associate Performance Director has the responsibility to then determine all final event entries.

8 ANNOUNCEMENT

- 8.1 The 2024 Olympic Games nominations will be formally announced by the British Olympic Association on or before 15th June 2024.

NOMINATION POLICY GENERAL CONDITIONS

Eligibility

- G1 To be eligible to compete at the Paris 2024 Olympic Games, each athlete shall:
- hold a valid British passport and be eligible to represent Great Britain;
 - meet British Swimming's, UK Sport's and the BOA's rules on representing Team GB at the Olympic Games;
 - have completed a Nomination Acceptance Form to confirm they will be available to participate. Failure to do so will be interpreted as non-availability by British Swimming. Nomination Acceptance Forms will be provided by British Swimming to qualifying team members;
 - not to be subject to any live sanction issued by British Swimming, UK Anti-Doping or FINA;
 - agree to comply with the FINA and UK Anti-Doping rules and anti-doping blood/urine testing policies;
 - not be serving a ban from participation in the sport for any reason (including but not limited to, as a result of being found guilty of a doping offence or being found guilty of an offence relating to betting, manipulation of results, corrupt conduct, inside information) at the time of selection and/or at the time of the Event;
 - have a Global Health Insurance Certificate or approved medical insurance;
 - satisfy any eligibility criteria imposed by the BOA, IOC and/or FINA; and
 - sign a BOA Team Members Agreement.

Team Commitments

All Team members will be required to:

- G2 Comply with the British Swimming Code of Conduct. A breach of the British Swimming Code of Conduct may result in de-Nomination from the team.
- G3 Abide by media protocols of the British Diving Programme. Divers must only speak to the media about their own performances. The Head Coach Olympic Diving and event Team Leader may discuss performances of the entire team.
- G4 Not take holiday or attend overseas camps and/or competitions between the British Championships and the meet for which they have been selected without prior written approval from the Head Coach Olympic Diving.
- G5 Make themselves available for all team activities designated by the Head Coach Olympic Diving (including but not limited to preparation camps and staging camps). No team member will be allowed to leave a national team camp or undertake any activities that are not directly relevant to the team camp programme, this includes any external media, sponsor or social activities. Failure to attend the required activities could result in withdrawal from the team. Under exceptional circumstances, written approval to be excluded from activities may be given by the Head Coach Olympic Diving.



- G6 Comply with British Swimming and FINA swimwear regulations.

De-Selection and Replacement

- G7 If for any reason an athlete is unable or unwilling to fully comply with the Team Commitments (G2 to G5) they may be withdrawn from the team.
- G8 Divers becoming unfit due to illness or injury (physical or mental) at any time following their Nomination must notify British Swimming immediately and will be required to undertake a full medical examination which may result in the swimmer being de-selected from the team at the complete discretion of the Head Coach Olympic Diving. In the event of injury or illness athletes may be deselected if they pose a risk to themselves, other athletes or team staff as determined by the British Swimming Chief Medical Officer or their designate.
- G9 De-selection of athletes, and/or replacement of athletes withdrawn from the team prior to the Delegation Registration Meeting ("DRM"), currently scheduled for 12 July 2024, will be considered at the sole discretion of the Nomination Panel following consultation with the BOA if viewed to be in the best interest of the overall team performance. Where athletes are de-selected from the Team following the DRM, any replacement decisions shall be made by the BOA (in consultation with British Swimming) in accordance with the IOC Late Athlete Replacement Policy.

Other

- G10 The World Class Leadership Team (WCLT), in conjunction with the BOA, may amend this Nomination Policy at any time at its discretion.

Appeals

- G11 Any appeals against nominations in relation to Nomination policies must be made in accordance with the British Swimming Team Nomination Appeals Procedures, available at: <https://www.britishswimming.org/performance/swimming/Nomination-policies/team-Nomination-appeals/> or by request from Adam Clarke, Associate Director Performance Strategy and Operations, via email at adam.clarke@swimming.org. Athletes should be aware of the time limits contained in the Procedures, which are designed with the intention of resolving issues expeditiously and fairly.
